Are you interested in joining the largest, active amateur organization in the country? The American Radio Relay League, Inc. is a national, non-commercial association of radio amateurs bonded for the more effective relaying of friendly messages between their stations, for legislative protection, for orderly operation, and for the improvement of practical, two-way, short-wave radiotelegraphic communication.

It is an incorporated association without capital stock, chartered under the laws of Connecticut. Its affairs are governed by a Board of seventeen Directors, elected every two years by the general membership. The officers, in turn, are elected by the Directors from among their number. The League is non-commercial and no one commercially engaged in the manufacture, sale or rental of radio apparatus is eligible to membership on the Board.

"Of, by and for the amateur", it numbers within its ranks practically every worth-while amateur in the United States, Canada and many in foreign countries, and has a history of glorious achievement as the standard bearer in amateur affairs.

QST, the premier amateur radio magazine, is the official organ of the League. Published exclusively by and for the amateur, it contains news of everything of interest to him that occurs in the amateur field; articles dealing with all phases of technical radio as related to amateur reception and transmission are regularly published.

The only essential requirement for membership in the League is a BONA-FIDE INTEREST in radio. Station ownership, while desirable, is not necessary. The dues for membership, which also includes a years subscription to QST, are \$2.00 a year.
